- No exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit for competition in any class.
- 2. 3. Check-in is from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 4, 2024 for pre-registered exhibits. All entries are accepted online only and new entries will not be accepted on site.

- No exhibits or packages of vegetables entered in one class shall be eligible for premiums in any other class. 5.

- No premiums will be awarded in any class unless the exhibits are of optimum maturity and free of defect and soil. The judges may withhold any premiums for lack of merit or award second or third premiums only if deemed best. Misnamed varieties will not be considered eligible for premiums. All entries become the property of the Farm Show unless marked "*will call for*" and are claimed between 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 13, 2024. If to be claimed by a representative, "*will call for*" must appear on the general entry Blank. Any remaining vegetables that are not picked up by 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 13, 2024, will be donated to the food bank. Any exhibit removed prior to the listed times without Show Management 7. approval will result in forfeiture of all premiums.
